PROCLAMATION OF THE WORD David C Clark & Katie Brown-Bright
Mark 10:17-31

As he was setting out on a journey, a man ran up and knelt before him and asked him, “Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?” Jesus said to him, “Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: ‘You shall not murder. You shall not commit adultery. You shall not steal. You shall not bear false witness. You shall not defraud. Honor your father and mother.’” He said to him, “Teacher, I have kept all these since my youth.” Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said, “You lack one thing; go, sell what you own, and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.” When he heard this, he was shocked and went away grieving, for he had many possessions.

Then Jesus looked around and said to his disciples, “How hard it will be for those who have wealth to enter the kingdom of God!” And the disciples were perplexed at these words. But Jesus said to them again, “Children, how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for someone who is rich to enter the kingdom of God.” They were greatly astounded and said to one another, “Then who can be saved?” Jesus looked at them and said, “For mortals it is impossible, but not for God; for God all things are possible.”

THE WEEKLY OFFERING

Household Goods is in Acton, and, for over 30 years, has been helping people in need to furnish homes. Each year, Household Goods furnishes 2,500 homes with 60,000 pieces of furniture and smaller household items.

Referred by social service agencies in Massachusetts, people in need include the recently homeless, survivors of domestic violence, low income individuals and families immigrants, veterans, victims of disaster, or those coping with illness or disability.

900 dedicated volunteers work over 40,000 hours a year to make this all happen. Our own HYG has volunteered there, as part of a local service trip.

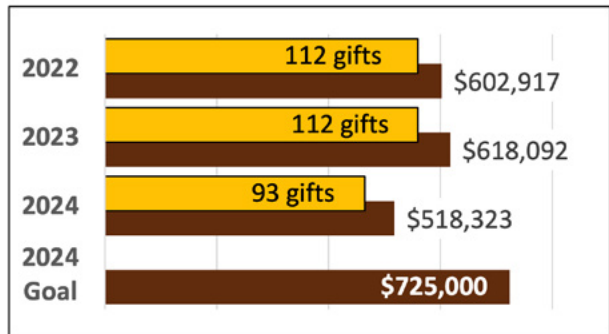
UPDATE FROM THE ANNUAL GIVING COMMITTEE

Thanks to so many of you, the annual gifts that fund all of our good work and worship for the coming year are flowing in.

Here is where the giving campaign is as of **Friday 2/9/24**

Total # of Pledges received = 93 made as follows:

- Pledges Online = 27
- Pledges on Giving Sunday = 38
- Pledges by Mail = 24
- Pledges made by phone = 3
- Pledges made by email = 1



Total Amount Pledged: \$518,323 or 71% of goal (\$725,000)

The bar chart above captures commitment data as of Dec. 29, 2023. The numbers are good, but we are hoping for better. You will see that for 2024 we are lagging behind 2023 and 2022, both in number of gifts and the amounts committed in each year. The goal we need to meet this year is \$725,000, are we are currently about \$221,000 short of that.
