Capital Campaign - Congregational Meeting - May 19^{th}

Please stay after church on May 19 th for a short congregational meeting to approve the overall scope of the capital campaign including the ground source heating system. This is needed to move onto the next steps of the campaign including: engaging the architect and energy consultants to create design documentation and hire contractors for completing the project; identifying the scope of the project including the ground source heating system; authorizing Standing Committee to enter into a construction contract; and authorizing the borrowing to fund the expenses of the entire construction project in excess of contributions in hand, prior to receiving rebates for energy efficient modifications to our building. We will not have any additional plans to share at that time as we will begin the design phase after approval. We will bring designs to the congregation for discussion when appropriate in the process. We need a quorum of 75 people

to be in the sanctuary or on zoom on May 19th. Please plan to attend.

THE WEEKLY OFFERING

Concord Prison Outreach (CPO) is a nonprofit organization in Concord, Massachusetts. It dates back to 1968 and is independent, volunteer driven, and maintains an active steering committee and board of directors. CPO operates with the support of approximately 35 Massachusetts faith-based organizations, as well as with the support of individuals from around the state. At any given point of time, the organization maintains over 100 working volunteers in the Massachusetts prisons. CPO reports that their programs are meant to challenge, change and improve the lives of participants. The organization's list of program offerings includes: anger management, personal and emotional improvement, basic adult education and high school equivalency. ESL, managing money. parenting groups, the "Read to me Daddy "program, library services, computer skills, art for the community, job search skills, re-entry support, writing skills, book discussion groups, math for college placement, book drives for children of inmates, and other outreach projects.
